Councilwoman Whitman

Resolution #20
Declaring Lead Agency Status Regarding the Proposed Zoning Change Along the Route 67 Corridor

Introduced by: Supervisor

WHEREAS, the Town of Stillwater is proposing zoning amendments along the Route 67 Corridor in the Town of Stillwater, Saratoga County, New York, to accommodate increased demand for commercial/industrial space; and

WHEREAS, the proposed action encompasses rezoning the Route 67 Corridor to permit mixed uses; and

WHEREAS, the proposed action has been determined to be a Type 1 Listed Action, pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) 6 NYCRR Part 617.4; and

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that pursuant to the applicable standards of SEQRA 6 NYCRR Part 617.6, the Town Board of the Town of Stillwater concludes that it is the appropriate agency to serve as Lead Agency for the coordinated environmental review of the proposed Listed Action; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby declares its intent to be Lead Agency for the coordinated SEQRA evaluation; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby authorizes the circulation of the Lead Agency Agreement to the other Involved and Interested Agencies, indicating the Town Board’s intention to serve as Lead Agency, including circulating the Part 1 of the Full Environmental Assessment Form (EAF).

Motion by Councilman Petronis and seconded by Councilwoman Bruno to adopt Resolution #20.
