Public Input

Tony B asked for a clear definition of the area to be rezoned in regard to the Route 67 Corridor. Supervisor Kinowski stated that the rezoning would be from George Thompson rd East towards Mechanicville. Supervisor Kinowski commented on the inter-modal railroad yard coming in that area which will be a major hub between Chicago and Boston. The rezoning will make it easier for residents to build, sell and possibly make their property slightly more valuable.

Mike C questioned whether the Town could possibly receive fuel at a budget pricing like home owners.

Supervisor Kinowski commented that pricing is dependent on profit or loss margin. Supt Minick stated that he has never seen this done before.

Curtis R inquired about development and rezoning in the Fitch Road, Farley Road and Route 67 area.

Supervisor Kinowski stated that prior to him being in office there was discussion and a conceptual drawing of a business park in that area. He further stated that there was a large volume of open space and the economic possibilities were endless with the growth meeting the rural area and blending in with its surrounding.

Councilwoman Bruno suggested that the Supervisor touch on some of the open space that has been acquired which balances out future development within the Town. Supervisor Kinowski touched on areas of Route 32 & 423.
