Saratoga Cluster (Jib Drive)

Supervisor Kinowski brought to the Boards attention the matter of additional monies being requested from the developer of Saratoga Cluster (Jib Drive) on top of what has already been paid. The developer is requesting the Town reduce the amount to half of seven thousand to thirty-five hundred.

<u>Motion</u> by Supervisor Kinowski and seconded by Councilman Baker to reduce the amount requested to thirty-five hundred dollars.

Discussion was held on adjusted fees, Planning Board's thoughts, loss of revenue and basis for the fees. **Motion carried.**

<u>Saratoga County Sewer District (extending boundaries)</u>

<u>Motion</u> by Supervisor Kinowski and seconded by Councilwoman Bruno to extend the boundaries of Stillwater into the Saratoga County Sewer Dist which would include the Village of Stillwater. <u>Motion carried.</u>

<u>Budget:</u> Supervisor Kinowski requested a resolution for the Town Board to consider at the next meeting extending Sheila Silic's hours from 25 hours to 35 hours to work the additional ten hours for the building dept.

Public Input

Art G inquired about the Community Center's having leaks in the new gym and if they have completed their new contract.

Supervisor Kinowski stated that they are looking into where the leak is coming from and the contract is still being written.

Mike C suggested that the Town pay the Community Centers oil & electric and than deduct that amount from their budgeted line item.

Art F commented on the sewer district extension and questioned Resolution #41 regarding minor subdivision.

Supervisor Kinowski explained the reason behind Resolution #41 and stated that it just giving them time to review the process and fees associated with it.

Councilwoman Bruno commented that the Town is still gaining from taxes on two parcels instead of one.

Marty D. stated that he was on the GEIS committee and it was the committees understanding that there would be no fees on minor subdivision.

Discussion was held on the fees, establishing a sliding scale and exemptions, etc.

Mike C commended the Town Board for holding discussion openly on Town business and commented on exemption given to Global Foundries/AMD.
