WHEREAS, in order for Town employees to take advantage of the early retirement incentives, two local laws must be adopted to enable the Town to offer the incentive to its employees;

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that public hearings are hereby scheduled for August 5, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. and 7:05 p.m. at the Stillwater Town Hall, 66 East Street, Stillwater, New York 12170 to consider a local laws providing for early retirement incentives from the New York State retirement system.

Discussion: Supervisor Kinowski stated that this was mandatory it was just a cost saving option. For this to happen, the Town needs to pass a local law, resolve to cover the law and how to achieve this. A discussion was held on the when this would be effective for and the incentive for an employee. Supervisor Kinowski read the proposed Local Laws:

A LOCAL LAW TO ADOPT THE 2010 RETIREMENT INCENTIVE PROGRAM PURSUANT TO PART A – CHAPTER 105, LAWS OF 2010

A LOCAL LAW electing a retirement incentive program as authorized by Chapter 105, Laws of 2010 for the eligible employees of the Town of Stillwater.

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Stillwater, as follows:

1. The Town of Stillwater hereby elects to provide all of its eligible employees with a retirement incentive program authorized by Chapter 105, Laws of 2010.

- 2. The commencement date of the retirement incentive program shall be October 1, 2010.
- 3. The open period during which eligible employees may retire and receive the additional retirement benefits, shall be ninety (90) days in length and shall end on December 29, 2010.
- 4. The actuarial present value of the additional retirement benefits payable pursuant to the provisions of this local law shall be paid as one lump sum, or in five annual installments. The amount of the annual payment shall be determined by the Actuary of the New York State and Local Employees' Retirement System, and it shall be paid by the Town of Stillwater for each employee who receives the retirement benefits payable under this local law.
 - 5. This act shall take effect August 19, 2010.

A LOCAL LAW TO ADOPT THE 2010 RETIREMENT INCENTIVE PROGRAM PURSUANT TO PART B – CHAPTER 105, LAWS OF 2010

A LOCAL LAW electing a retirement incentive program as authorized by Chapter 105, Laws of 2010 for the eligible employees of the Town of Stillwater.

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Stillwater, as follows:

- 6. The Town of Stillwater hereby elects to provide all of its eligible employees with a retirement incentive program authorized by Chapter 105, Laws of 2010.
- 7. The commencement date of the retirement incentive program shall be October 1, 2010.
- 8. The open period during which eligible employees may retire and receive the additional retirement benefits, shall be ninety (90) days in length and shall end on December 29, 2010.
- 9. The actuarial present value of the additional retirement benefits payable pursuant to the provisions of this local law shall be paid as one lump sum, or in five annual installments. The amount of the annual payment shall be determined by the Actuary of the New York State and Local Employees' Retirement System, and it shall be paid by the Town of Stillwater for each employee who receives the retirement benefits payable under this local law.
 - 10. This act shall take effect August 19, 2010.
