Supervisor Connelly called the meeting to order and led everyone in the Pledge to the Flag.

Sue Cunningham, Town Clerk took the roll call.

Communications: There were no communications at this time.

<u>Reports</u>: Supervisor Connelly reported that there would be a budget workshop immediately following the Town Board meeting.

Public Input (Privilege of the Floor)

Resident I inquired about Resolution #137, the safety of the town offices computer software, and an article written from the Mayor of Mechanicville regarding the Reservoir.

Attorney Trainor stated that the applicant paid for a building permit but decided not to build at this time.

Supervisor Connelly stated that all data is stored on the server and with BAS.

Resident II inquired about the highway union negotiations, Resolution #135, and commented that people on Social Security would not be receiving a raise and believes that Town should freeze salaries for the 2010 budget.

Councilman Petronis stated that they would be meeting within the next week with Attorney's and union representatives.

Supervisor Connelly stated that the salary in Resolution #135 would not exceed \$1,800.

Resident III inquired if all town offices were networked, if the personnel policy has been implemented, mortgage & sales tax and Resolution #133.

Supervisor Connelly stated that he did reach out to try and get a grant through the Senators office for networking but never received anything and he stated that feels that the budget he prepared regarding the mortgage & sales tax is realistic.

Attorney Trainor stated that Resolution #133 deals with acquiring and conveying of property the Town has been using but never paid for.

Attorney Joe Sheehan gave a brief account of the matter before the in regard to Resolution #135. Supervisor Connelly stated that an alternative to the Board paying the full amount was that they could share the cost of the surveying.

Resident IV inquired who is paying the taxes on the property in question regarding Resolution #133.

Councilman Petronis stated that the owner is paying taxes on the piece in question.

Resident V inquired if there would be any zoning issues that could come of this down the road. Attorney Trainor stated that he didn't believe so.

Attorney Sheehan stated that there was no zoning issue for them.

Resident VI comment that the Town should pay the entire cost of the surveying if they took the property, inquired about Resolution #134, if flag people doing construction are certified, the burn law and the speed limit from the four corners to the lake.

Supervisor Connelly stated that Resolution #134 was the water line the County is running and the new burn law is DEC law but you still have to obtain a burn permit from the Town. Sup't Minick stated that the flag people are certified and attend annual training.

Councilman Petronis stated that the speed limit is 55mph in that area.
