RESOLVED, that pursuant to the authority vesting in the Town Board by virtue of the New York State Constitution and the Municipal Home Rule Law, the Town Board hereby exercises the authority to supersede New York State Town Law Sections 264 and 265 requiring ten (10) days prior publication of the Public Hearing and shortening the period to five (5) days prior to the hearing pursuant to Municipal Home Rule Law Section 20; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk is directed to immediately post and publish the attached Local Law with Notice of Public Hearing in the Schenectady Gazette or the Mechanicville Express preferably ten (10) days prior to December 19, 2013 but no later than five (5) days prior to December 19, 2013 and to obtain Affidavits of Publication therefore; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk shall complete and file in the Office of the Town Clerk Affidavits of Posting/Publication, respectively, not later than five (5) days after the Public Hearing; and be it further

RESOLVED, that The Chazen Companies are hereby directed to immediately refer the proposed Zoning Code Amendments to the Town and Saratoga County Planning Boards pursuant to the Town's Zoning Code and Section 239-m of the General Municipal Law, respectively, for its review and recommendations prior to December 19, 2013; and be it further

RESOLVED, that approval of the Zoning Amendments require the Town Clerk to publish Notice of the Adoption of the Local Law and shall be effective ten (10) days after such publication or immediately on someone personally served with a copy pursuant to Town Law §265.

RESOLVED, that The Chazen Companies ensure compliance with NYS Agriculture & Markets Law Articles 25-AA, 25-AAA, especially Section 305-a thereto, if applicable, and also ensure that the requirements of the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA") are complied with as necessary.
