<u>Water:</u> Supt Minick gave public notification on the results of lead & copper in the water according to DOH regulations and criteria.

Supervisor Kinowski spoke on the water authority & EPA testing system.

A brief discussion was held.

Public Input

Margaret M inquired about Mackey's water system and notification from them. She also questioned the Town's debt.

Supt Minick stated that Mackey is required to test his water, do a chlorine test daily and they should be sending out notification to water users on results same as the Town does. Supervisor Kinowski gave a brief synopsis of the Town budget and discussed what debts the town has paid off since coming into office.

Mike C asked how many police cars the Town has.

Supervisor Kinowski stated that there were 3 cars in service.

Cameron B questioned if the Town could get more from the car if they scrapped the vehicle rather than sell.

Supervisor Kinowski stated they could get more through scrap only if they broke it done to parts.

Briana B commented on cleaner water.
