Resolution #16 Support SLPID Water Chestnut Treatment

Introduced by: <u>Supervisor</u>

WHEREAS, Saratoga Lake Protection & Improvement District (SLPID) is applying for a NYSDEC Invasive Species Rapid Response and Control Grant to treat approximately five (5) acres of water chestnuts (Trapa natans) with the systemic herbicide Clearcast in the area of the mouth of Kayaderosseras Creek;

WHEREAS, water chestnuts are prone to nuisance levels of growth in this area of Saratoga Lake and were eradicated several times through hand harvesting by Saratoga Lake Association volunteers and hydoraked by others;

WHEREAS, the water chestnuts are an annual plant that prefers water between 1 and 6 feet deep and reproduces mainly by seed that germinates on the lake bottom, grows a root and sends up 10 to 15 stems that end in a rosette of floating leaves;

WHEREAS, the primary goal of this grant is to assist SLPID in building their capacity to control and ultimately permanently remove plants or animals that meet the definition of invasive species or nuisance species.

WHEREAS, SLPID's lake aquatic invasive species manager is Solitude Herbicide who recommends using Clearcast herbicide, a systemic herbicide applied when the plants are actively growing and works gradually over 30-45 days on the target plants ; and following elimination of surface plants from the first application, the underlayer of plants is expected to grow and require a second application;

Now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, the Town of Stillwater supports the application for grant funds for the treatment of water chestnuts in Saratoga Lake.
