Public Hearing Tax Cap

Supervisor Kinowski stated that the 2018 Budget does not exceed the 2% tax cap so there is no need to adopt the proposed local law exceeding the tax cap.

Public Hearing 2018 Budget

Supervisor Kinowski gave a brief overview of the preliminary budget.

Supervisor Kinowski stated before finalizing the budget they need to act on adding an additional employee to the Highway Dept. This was discussed at the budget workshop but they need to decide on this.

After a brief discussion the Town Board agreed to add a new employee to the Highway Dept.

Dick D inquired as to the difference between the tentative budget and preliminary budget. Supervisor Kinowski stated that it went 9 cents to 19 cents with the additional employee.

With everyone having the opportunity to comment Supervisor Kinowski declared the public hearing closed at 7:25 pm.

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor is hereby authorized to sign and the attorneys and engineers to the Town are directed to prepare and file all necessary documents to

effectuate the transfer of the King's Isle Water Line to the Town of Stillwater.
