# Resolution #77 Adopt Local Law No. 3 of 2017, A Local Law Amending Local Law No. 4 of 2007 to Extend the Time Period for the Cold War Veterans Property Tax Exemption

Introduced by: <u>Supervisor</u>

WHEREAS, Local Law No. 4 of 2007 allows a partial property tax assessment exemption for Cold War Veterans up to a maximum of ten (10) years; and

WHEREAS, the State of New York has recently amended the Real Property Tax Law to allow the Cold War Veterans partial property tax assessment exemption to be extended for as long as the property and veteran qualify for the exemption; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on Thursday, November 16, 2017 to hear comments from the public on the proposed Local Law to extend the duration of the exemptions;

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that Local Law No. 3 of 2017, a Local Law Amending Local Law No. 4 of 2007 to Extend the Time Period for the Cold War Veterans Property Tax Exemption for as long as the property and the veteran qualify for the exemption under the NYS Real Property Tax Law, is hereby adopted.

## Local Law #3 LOCAL LAW NO. 3 OF 2017

Local Law Amending Local Law No. 4 of 2007 to Extend the Time Period for the Cold War Veterans Real Property Tax Exemption

**SECTION 1: PURPOSE** 

§2: ADOPTION

New York State authorizes counties, towns and villages to make available a partial real property tax exemption to qualified veterans of the Cold War. The Town Board of the Town of Stillwater has determined that it is appropriate to make this exemption available to qualified veterans of the Cold War in recognition of their service to our country, and to extend the time period that the exemption is applicable.

(A) The Town of Stillwater adopted the partial exemption from real property taxation for owner-occupied real property owned by qualified veterans of the Cold War authorized by §458-b of the New York State Real Property Tax Law by Local Law No. 4 of 2007 on

§458-b of the New York State Real Property Tax Law by Local Law No. 4 of a November 20, 2007.

(B) Subject to the provisions of §3 of this Local Law, this exemption shall be administered in accordance with the definitions and procedures of §458-b of the Real Property Tax Law, as originally enacted by chapter 655 of the Laws of 2007, and any applicable amendments enacted thereafter, including but not limited to Chapter 290 of the Law of 2017.

#### §3: EXEMPTION LIMITATIONS

(A) Subject to the maximum specified in paragraph (B) of this section, the qualified Cold War veteran shall be entitled to a reduction of ten percent of the assessed value of his or her residence.

- (B) Notwithstanding paragraph (A) of this section, an exemption granted pursuant to this Local Law shall not exceed the product of \$8,000 multiplied by the latest State equalization rate.
- (C) In addition to the exemption provided by paragraphs (A) and (B) of this Section, where the Cold War veteran received a compensation rating from the United States veterans affairs or from the United States department of defense because of a service connected disability, qualifying residential real property shall be exempt from taxation to the extent of the product of the assessed value of such property multiplied by fifty percent of the Cold War veteran disability rating; provided, however, that such exemption shall not exceed forty thousand dollars, or the product of forty thousand dollars multiplied by the latest State equalization rate for assessing unit.

#### **§4: DURATION OF EXEMPTION**

Pursuant to the authority contained in Chapter 290 of the Law of 2017 adopted by the State of New York on September 12, 2017 as an amendment to RPTL §458-b, the Town hereby extends the above partial tax exemptions to qualifying owners of qualifying real property for so long as they remain qualifying owners of qualifying real property without regard to the ten (10) year limitation contained in RPTL §458-b(2)(c)(iii). 3

#### 5: EFFECTIVE DATE

The Local Law shall take effect immediately and shall apply to assessment rolls prepared on the basis of taxable status dates occurring on or after January 1, 2018.

# Resolution #78 Awarding the Bid for Constructing a Pavilion at Brown's Beach

WHEREAS, competitive bids were solicited and opened on November 20, 2017 for the construction of the pavilion at Brown's Beach; and

WHEREAS, three (3) conforming bid combinations were submitted and the General Municipal Law requires that the contract be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder;

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby determines that the lowest responsible base bid combination was received from Plank Construction LLC; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Supervisor is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with Plank Construction LLC and to disburse the needed funds as appropriate.
