WHEREAS, the Owners of vacant land near the intersection of County Routes 75 and 76 have offered 10 acres for sale of \$90,000.00.

Resolution #23

Establishing the New Water Rates for 2019

Introduced by: <u>Supervisor</u>

WHEREAS, the Town Highway Superintendent has advised the Town Board that decreases in maintenance, operating and delivery costs necessitate an decrease in water rates in several town water districts; and

WHEREAS, NYS Town Law section 198 (3) (d) authorizes the Town Board to establish, from time to time, the appropriate water rates to be paid by consumers and to impose liens and penalties, and to discontinue water service, for unpaid water charges.

NOW, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the following rates for water usage are hereby established by the Town Board, to begin with the April 2019 billing cycle:

- (a) In Consolidated Water District #6, the new rate will be \$8.05 per 1000 gallons;
- (b) In Water District #5, Extension 1, the new rate will be \$7.05 per 1000 gallons;
- (c) In Water District #5, the rate will remain unchanged at \$8.95 per 1000 gallons.

And be it further

RESOLVED, that in these districts and in all other Town water districts, water charges shall be a lien upon the real property upon which (or in connection with which) the water was used, unpaid water charges in arrears for 30 days or longer shall be subject to a penalty of up to 10% of the amount due, and the water supply to a property that is 60 or more days from the due date in arrears in its payment of water charges may be cut-off without further notice.

Supervisor Kinowski stated that the sale does not affect the Town, approximately \$435,000 is received and the Town purchased Brown's Beach but if Fab 8.2 is built the Town will receive monies from Global.

A Discussion was held on BOCREST in regard to the traffic study, notifications and no significant changes to warrant another public hearing.

Danielle Cowin, Tax Collector reported that she will have hours on March 30, 2019 from 9am to 12pm for collecting of taxes.

Supervisor Kinowski spoke briefly on the snack shack at the beach. He stated that it is possible it will be run by the Town with the help of volunteers and hiring some kids. The Town will look into purchasing some small equipment.
